Through the end of Summer of 2019, Santa Cruz County Animal Shelter (SCCAS) is offering special adoption prices for all kittens and cats at their Santa Cruz shelter, 1001 Rodriguez St. Due to a high volume of kittens and cats in the Shelter, SCCAS wants to ensure that these healthy, adoptable pets are offered a second chance to find a new forever home.

Feline adoption fees usually range from \$55 to \$120. The current price special will be \$19, in honor of 2019. Adoption fees include the following services:

- Spay/Neuter
- Initial worming and vaccinations
- Rabies vaccine (over three months of age)
- Microchip
- Cardboard cat carrier
