6. New Business

6.1 OR3 New Staff - Amanda Gullings & Clare Peabody

David Reid introduced OR3's two new Emergency Service Analysts:

- Amanda briefly shared her professional history, including service as a Police Officer in the Santa Cruz Police Department and Emergency Manager for University of California Santa Cruz
- Clare briefly shared her professional history, including work as a lifeguard in state parks,
 CZU EOC extra help in the care and shelter branch, and recent hazard mitigation consulting.

6.2 CruzAware update

David Reid shared that OR3 continues to refine the CruzAware system and that solutions to recent concerns, including excessive and ill-timed NOAA weather notifications, duplicative alert messages, and ability for jurisdictions to generate unique messages, are being developed. He added that Amanda is developing standard operating procedures for use by jurisdictions who aim to generate unique alerts.

 Bob Wiser inquired as to whether CruzAware had the capacity to override the "Do Not Disturb" mobile phone setting. Dave Reid stated that emergency alerts will override this setting but nonemergent messages will not. Amanda added that a CruzAware mobile application would be prudent given its capacity to receive





notifications regardless of the do not disturb setting and that a timeline for development of such an application is being determined.

6.3 Emergency Operations Plan Update

Dave Reid reminded the EMC that the County's Emergency Operations Plan had not been updated since 2015. Accordingly, the 2023 update should be considered a complete rewrite given the need to address current state requirements, especially as they relate to Access and Functional Needs populations. The 2023 plan will be submitted to CalOES for review 11/15 and feedback is expected by March 2024. Given the extent to which updates were required, OR3 expects additional information will be required by CalOES before the plan is considered finalized.

The 2023 plan updated highlights the need for formation of three different emergency preparedness groups, in which the EMC may participate:

- A "Readiness Working Group" (RWG), which would be comprised of agencies deeply involved in disaster planning.
- CEMT internal partners to organize.
- A County leadership policy group, essentially an EOC activation group, made up of key agencies (law, fire, CAO) to inform operational decisions.

6.4 Meeting Structure/Cadence

The EMC unanimously agreed to maintain the existing meeting schedule, with meetings occurring the first Thursday of every other month, except for July.

7.3 City of Santa Cruz – Chief Robert Oatey

Chief Oatey shared the following updates:

- The City of Santa Cruz is seeking to fill Paul Horvat's place and that he will make the job description available to the group.
- A tabletop exercise occurred on 10/31 with 69 City employees, many of whom were new to emergency response. Inclusion of new participants was strategic, to build a deeper bench of individuals prepared to support in the event of a disaster. An AAR for that exercise is under way.
- Tech and other updates are needed for the City EOC.
- The City will have a table at the upcoming Cold Water Classic, sharing resources for fire and water environment safety (**Know before you go campaign**).
- Development of the Watch Tower Platform is underway; City is seeking buy-in from other agencies. Platform would provide access to beach hazard alerts, event alerts etc. Donna encouraged that this type of messaging, especially beach hazard and safety messaging, be disseminated in school settings to reduce incidents of accidental injury/drowning for youth at local beaches.
