

Juvenile Hall Division at-a-Glance 2023

Juvenile Hall provides temporary, secure custody of young people detained by Law Enforcement, Probation, and the Juvenile Court.

Juvenile Justice Realignment

- SB 823: transfers responsibility for custody, supervision, & services from the state to local jurisdictions.
- · Partnership with Sonoma Probation Secure Youth Treatment Facility (SYTF) to host Santa Cruz youth. Probation provides transport t
 - month for families to visit their youth. Tablets and MiFi units available for families to visit virtually with their youth.
- SB 92: young person's case originates in juvenile court may be held in detention until age 25.

Youth Served

- Juvenile Hall Capacity: 42 youth
- Youth pending adjudication ages 12-18 years
- 53% of Youth Booked Were on Probation
- Youth Served in 2023:

- 222 youth admitted.
 - Average Daily Population was 10.2.
- - Low percentage of detention overrides
 - Alternative to Detention Programs
 - 98% Successful Completion
- A 14% decrease in length of stay from 2013 attributed to:
 SB823 & SB 92- youth to be served locally.
